

## Stocktaking and assessment of Urban Circular Collaborative Economy initiatives

Period of Performance: 2018-2019

Urban circular economy that does not only include recycling of resources but also cooperative action, shared use of resources and cooperative repair was put at the centre of the study. Based on an analysis of the field in several European regions, guidance for cities and regions in how to support such initiatives was drafted and potentials on the European level identified.

ÖIR conducted spatial analyses of initiatives in the case study regions and thus contributed to the identification of success factors for the „collaborative economy“.

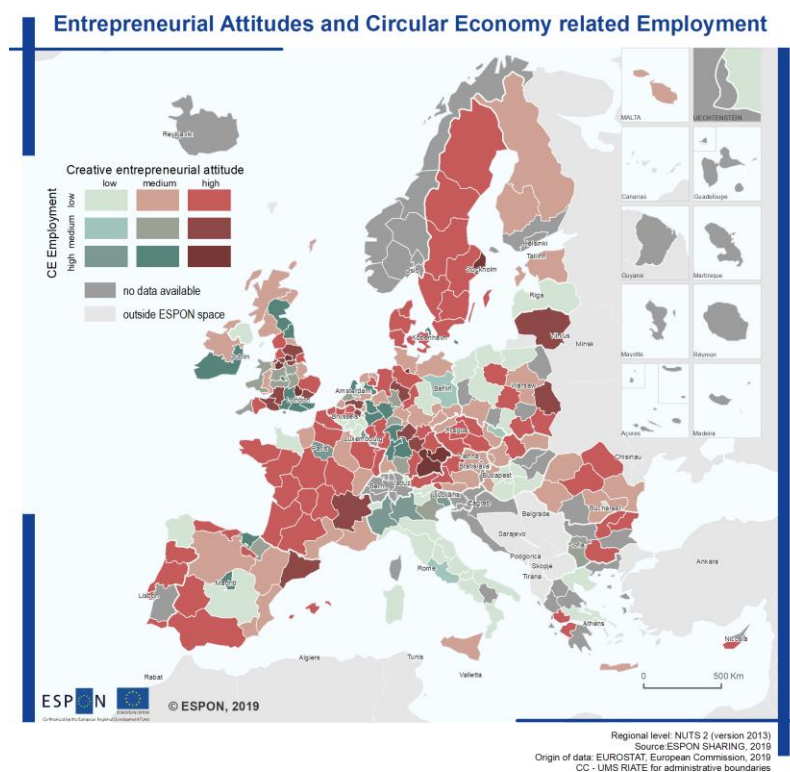
The distribution of actors in space was seen as a core factor, which depending on the type of initiative either profits from high density and concentration (e.g. regional value chains) or from spread out locations (e.g. shared mobility).
